So where did 2015 go? We can't believe we're nearly at the end of another year! KPC was opened on 28 Nov 1998 for the first time to young people—so we're now an amazing 17 years on And still getting up to 100 young people through our doors on some nights. We currently have around 350 young people on our Membership, with new members joining nightly!

We'd like to rec-ap on a few of the highlights of 2015—which included being presented with the Education Training Standards Quality Mark—which was a great achievement for us, and we were the first third sector organisation in Wales to achieve this!

We have also worked hard to develop further the work and support we have offered our local unemployed over the year—with additional support and training for unemployed of all ages. This has included digital up-skilling, help with job searches, updating or creating CVs, and training to enhance employability. Five have successfully completed training to obtain their CSCS Labourer's Cards since September. We have worked with over 100 local unemployed so far during 2015 giving them better opportunities for their futures.

Members have worked hard during 2015 to achieve their Inspire Awards for helping around the Centre—in the café and with younger members. Their help has been really appreciated, and we hope the skills they have learnt will help them in their futures.

Our Centre in Marlas has proved to be very popular and attendance has increased since it re-opened in May 2015, with opening there now extended from 6-9 pm on a Tuesday & Thursday night.

Not leaving out the 5-8s group—this is also having great take-up with over 20 younger people taking part in fun activities, crafts, sports on a Friday after-school.

Congratulations also to our Chair—Paula Lunnon—awarded Trustee of the Year at the recent BAVO Volunteer Awards in November.
